This course is suitable for anyone working within the agricultural industry, whether employer, employee or self-employed, and will help you identify the causes of injuries and ill health, eliminate hazards and control risks.

This course will give the participants a qualification to the highest level.

This comprehensive three-day course covers a wide range of First Aid emergencies, enabling all Participants to deal with an emergency situation with confidence in a prompt, safe and effective way.

CERTIFICATION

Assessment is on-going by the instructor, along with a multiple choice question paper, and a three year qualification will be issued to those who satisfy the criteria. In addition, the HSE strongly recommend that all students undergo an annual refresher programme of three hours.

Two certificates will be issued, one for HSE FAW and one for Farm element.
